

THE ANN C. SMITH HALL OF FAME AWARD COMPETITION

Ann C. Smith was the first President of the Georgia School Food Service Association (1950-55) and a professor of dietetics at Georgia College in Milledgeville. She devoted a lifetime to teaching nutrition and quality food preparation. She was a charter member of GSNA and the first Southeastern Regional Director of SNA.

The Hall of Fame is presented annually and it may be awarded to three people each year. It was designed to recognize persons who have made outstanding contributions to the Georgia School Nutrition Association and the child nutrition program. No more than three awards will be presented each year.

To be eligible for the Hall of Fame Award, a person must have:

- ◆ Reached a minimum age of 60.
- ◆ Retired with a minimum of 10 years of service in the school nutrition program.
- ◆ Held at least 10 years of continuous membership in SNA and GSNA prior to retirement.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF LOCAL ASSOCIATIONS:

- ◆ Collect applications for the Hall of Fame.
- ◆ Judge the applications using the GSNA Scorecard.
- ◆ Send the winning local application to the District President.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT ASSOCIATIONS:

- ◆ Collect all applications for the Hall of Fame from Local Chapters.
- ◆ Judge local applications using the GSNA score sheet.
- ◆ Send the winning District application to the GSNA Headquarters. **All District applications must be IN our office by March 2nd.**

ANN C. SMITH HALL OF FAME CRITERIA AND SCORE SHEET

State Judges shall be: Current Chairman of District Presidents, two Past Presidents, and a member of the State SNP staff.

Each entry into the Ann C. Smith Hall of Fame must have a completed application with documentation.
